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to incorporate spirituals into their performances, but they were often forced to leave the country because of racial discrimination. In 1940, the Negro Spirituals were invited to perform at the White House, marking the first time that African Americans had been invited to perform there. The group's performances were well-received, and they continued to tour the country, performing at various venues and events. They also recorded several albums, including "The Negro Spirituals" (1941), "The Negro Spirituals Sing" (1943), and "The Negro Spirituals Sing Again" (1945). The group disbanded in 1948, but their legacy lives on through their recordings and performances.
